September 24 - Melchizedek Devotional Perspective

2Sam. 20

The Rebellion of Sheba – costs him his head.

2Sa 20:1 And there came to be a man of Beliya'al, whose name was Sheba son of Bikri, a Binyamite. And he blew with the shophar, and said, "We have no part in Dawid, nor do we have inheritance in the son of Yishai – each one to his tents, O Yisra'ěl!"

2Sa 20:2 Then all the men of Yisra'ěl deserted Dawid, to follow Sheba the son of Bikri. But the men of Yehudah, from the Yarděn as far as Yerushalayim, clung to their sovereign.

2Sa 20:3 And Dawid came to his house at Yerushalayim. And the sovereign took the ten women, his concubines whom he had left to look after the house, and put them in a protected house and supported them, but did not go in to them. So they were shut up to the day of their death, living in widowhood.

2Sa 20:4 And the sovereign said to Amasa, "Call the men of Yehudah for me within three days, and be present here yourself."

2Sa 20:5 And Amasa went to call the men of Yehudah. But he delayed longer than the appointed time which Dawid had appointed him.

This seems to be the first time since David assigned Amasa as commander of the army, that David gives him orders. Amasa fails to present himself at the appointed time. Amasa delayed. Why? Did he favor what Sheba was doing? Thoughts to ponder.

Therefore, David turns to Abishai and sends him after Sheba.

2Sa 20:6 And Dawid said to Abishai, "Now Sheba son of Bikri is going to do us more evil than Abshalom. Take the servants of your master, and pursue him, lest he find for himself walled cities, and escape us."

2Sa 20:7 Then the men of Yo'ab went out after him, with the Kerěthites and the Pelěthites, and all the mighty men. And they went out of Yerushalayim to pursue Sheba son of Bikri.

2Sa 20:8 When they were near the large stone which is in Gib'on, Amasa came before them. And Yo'ab was dressed in battle armor, and on it was a girdle with a sword fastened in its sheath at his hips. And as he went forward, it fell out.

2Sa 20:9 And Yo'ab said to Amasa, "Peace, my brother?" And Yo'ab took Amasa by the beard with his right hand to kiss him.

Yo'ab [Joab] kills Amasa.

2Sa 20:10 But Amasa was not on guard against the sword in Yo'ab's hand. And he struck him with it in the stomach, and his inward parts poured out on the ground, and he did not strike him again, and he died. Then Yo'ab and Abishai his brother pursued Sheba son of Bikri.

2Sa 20:11 And a man, one of Yo'ab's men, stood beside him, and said, <u>"Whoever is well pleased with Yo'ab and whoever is for Dawid, let him follow Yo'ab!"</u>

Apparently Amasa doesn't die immediately.

2Sa 20:12 And Amasa was rolling in his blood in the middle of the highway. And the man saw that all the people stood still, so he moved Amasa from the highway to the field and threw a garment over him, when he saw that everyone who came upon him halted.

2Sa 20:13 When he was removed from the highway, all the men passed on after Yo'ab to pursue Sheba son of Bikri.

2Sa 20:14 And he passed over through all the tribes of Yisra'ěl to Aběl, and to Běyth Ma'akah, and to all the Běrites. And they were assembled and went after him too.

2Sa 20:15 And they went and besieged him in Aběl of Běyth Ma'akah, and they cast up a siege mound against the city. And it stood in a rampart, and all the people who were with Yo'ab battered the wall to throw it down.

A wise woman intercedes.

2Sa 20:16 Then a wise woman called out from the city, "Listen, listen! Please say to Yo'ab, 'Come nearby, so that I speak to you.'"

2Sa 20:17 And he came near to her, and the woman said, "Are you Yo'ab?" And he answered, "I am." Then she said to him, "Listen to the words of your female servant." And he answered, "I am listening."

2Sa 20:18 Then she spoke, saying, "In former times they often spoke, saying, 'Let them inquire of Aběl,' and so they ended *the matter*.

2Sa 20:19 "I am of the peaceable and trustworthy ones in Yisra'ěl. You seek to destroy a city and a mother in Yisra'ěl. Why do you swallow up the inheritance of יהוה?"

- 2Sa 20:20 And Yo'ab answered and said, "Far be it, far be it from me to swallow up or to destroy!
- 2Sa 20:21 "<u>That is not the case. But a man from the mountains of Ephrayim,</u>
 <u>Sheba son of Bikri by name, has raised his hand against the sovereign, against Dawid</u>. Hand him over, him alone, and I withdraw from the city." And the woman said to Yo'ab, "Look, his head is going to be thrown to you over the wall."

2Sa 20:22 So the woman in her wisdom went to all the people. And they cut off the head of Sheba son of Bikri, and threw it out to Yo'ab. Then he blew with the shophar, and they dispersed from the city, each one to his tent. And Yo'ab returned to the sovereign at Yerushalayim.

Yo'ab resumes position of commander of the army of Israel.

A Lament for Tyre

Though Tyre was an actual place of worldly abundance, Tyre also equates to being ruled by a 'king' which mirrored Satan as an unscrupulous ruler and merchant of this world. We will see this more clearly in Ezekiel 28.

Joh 12:31 "Now is the judgment of this world, now the ruler of this world^b shall be cast out. Footnote: ^bSee <u>Luk 4:6</u>.

Luk 4:6 And the devil said to Him, "All this authority I shall give You, and their esteem, for it has been delivered to me, b and I give it to whomever I wish. Footnote: bSee 2Co_4:4, Joh_12:31, Joh_14:30, Joh_16:11, 1Jn_5:19

Eph 2:1 And you were dead in trespasses and sins,^a Footnote: ^aSee also <u>Eph 2:5</u>, as well as <u>Mat 8:22</u>, <u>Rom 8:6</u>, <u>Col 2:13</u>, <u>1Ti 5:6</u>, <u>1Jn 3:14</u>, <u>Rev 3:1</u>.

Eph 2:2 in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the ruler of the authority of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience, b Footnote: b Eph_5:6, Col_3:6.

Eph 2:3 among whom also we all once lived in the lusts of our flesh, doing the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, as also the rest.

Pretty much all nations are involved with merchandising beyond the point of need that then spills over into want, greed, and wealth unmentionable. Pride, power, prestige, and elitism enters the picture. What may at first have seemed to serve viable purposes, proliferates into storing up treasures on earth and a disregard or minimalization of storing up heavenly treasures. The things of this world become elevated above the welfare of people. The 'wheel' of merchandising spends faster and faster with increase need for 'cheap labor' which leaves some workers with few options but to work hard labor for miniscule wages in order to even survive.

Eze 27:1 The word of יהוה came again to me, saying,

Eze 27:2 "Now, son of man, take up a lamentation for Tsor,

Eze 27:3 and you shall say to Tsor, 'You who dwell at the entrance to the sea, merchant of the peoples on many coastlands, thus said the Master יהוה,

Ellicott's Commentary: (3) At the entry of the sea.—The word for "entry" in the original is plural, and means the approaches to the sea, or harbors. Tyre had two of these, both remarkably good: the "Egyptian," facing the south, and the "Sidonian," facing the north, the latter having also an outer harbor or roadstead, formed by a ledge off the north-west extremity of the island. The former is now completely, and the latter nearly, filled up with sand and ruins.

Rev 18:11 "And the merchants of the earth weep and mourn over her, because no one buys their merchandise any more –

Rev 18:12 merchandise of gold and silver, and precious stone and pearls, and fine linen and purple, and silk and scarlet, and all citron wood, and every object of ivory, and every object of most precious wood and bronze and iron and marble,

Rev 18:13 and cinnamon and incense, and fragrant oil and frankincense, and wine and oil, and fine flour and wheat, and cattle and sheep, and horses and carriages, and bodies and lives of men.

Rev 18:14 "And the fruit that your being longed for has gone from you. And all your riches and splendour are lost to you, and you shall find them no more, not at all.

Rev 18:15 "The merchants of these, those who became rich by her, shall stand at a distance for fear of her torture, weeping and mourning,

- "O Tsor, you yourself have said, 'I am perfect in loveliness.'
- ❖ Eze 27:4 "Your borders are in the heart of the seas. Your builders have perfected your loveliness.
- ❖ Eze 27:5 "They have made all your timbers of fir trees from Senir. They took a cedar from Lebanon to make a mast for you.
- ❖ Eze 27:6 "From the oaks of Bashan they made your oars. They made your deck with ivory from the coasts of Kittim.
- ❖ Eze 27:7 "Of fine embroidered linen from Mitsrayim was your sail to serve you as banner. Of blue and purple from the coasts of Elishah was your covering.

Jdg 10:6 And the children of Yisra'ěl again did evil in the eyes of יהוה, and served the Ba'als and the Ashtoreths, and the mighty ones of Aram, and the mighty ones of Tsidon, and the mighty ones of Mo'ab, and the mighty ones of the children of Ammon, and the mighty ones of the Philistines – and forsook יהוה and did not serve Him.

Ezr 3:7 And they gave silver to the stonemasons and the carpenters, and food, and drink, and oil to the people of Tsidon and Tsor to bring cedar logs from Lebanon to the sea at Yapho, according to the permission which they had from Koresh sovereign of Persia.

Act 12:20 Now Herodes had been highly displeased with the people of Tsor and Tsidon, but with one mind they came to him, and having made Blastos the sovereign's eunuch their friend, they were asking for peace, because their country was supplied with food by the sovereign's *country*.

This vast ship, laden with all kinds of valuable wares, being wrecked, all her valuables, sailors, officers, etc. went to the bottom. Psa 75:2 "When I seize the appointed time, It is I who judge in uprightness.

Psa 75:3 "The earth and all its inhabitants are melted; It is I who set its columns firm. Selah.

Psa 75:4 "I said to the boasters, 'Do not boast,' And to the wrong, 'Do not lift up the

Psa 75:5 "Do not lift up your horn on high (You speak with a stiff neck)."

lsa 24:1 See, יהוה **is making the earth empty and making it waste, and shall overturn its surface, and shall scatter abroad its inhabitants.**

Isa 24:8 <u>The joy of the tambourine shall cease</u>, the noise of those who rejoice shall end, the joy of the lyre shall cease.

Isa 24:9 No more do they drink wine with a song, strong drink is bitter to those who drink it.

Isa 24:10 The deserted city shall be broken down, every house shall be shut, no one enters.

Who Can Stand Before You?

Psalm 76 expounds that no one can stand against Elohim. The people in which YHWH shows favor will prevail against all odds. Much like the hopeless situation Jerusalem found themselves in against Assyria. Though the <u>northern house of Israel had been exiled</u>, YHWH <u>spared the house of Judah</u> as they stood in awe; yet that awe, would be relatively short lived.

The opening verses of Psalm 76 tells us where <u>His booth and dwelling place</u> are. Remember, Yahusha HaMashiach, not only redeemed repented mankind and creation; but **He also redeemed His land**.

The <u>house of Israel</u> and the <u>house of Judah</u> both <u>had fornicated and committed adultery</u> against Him in His land! Today, <u>the inhabitants of His land do likewise</u>. The whore, Mystery Babylon, stretches out her 10 fingers globally; as she digs in her claws. This global cabal will be rectified. YHWH is just waiting <u>to seize the appointed time</u> stated in Psalm 75:2. He IS **The Melchizedek**.

Deu 4:7 "For what great nation is there which has Elohim so near to it, as יהוה our Elohim is to us, whenever we call on Him?

Deu 4:8 "And what great nation is there that has such laws and righteous right-rulings like all this Torah which I set before you this day?

Psa 76:1 In Yehudah Elohim is known; His Name is great in Yisra'ěl.

Psa 76:2 And His booth is in Shalem,^a And His dwelling place in Tsiyon. Footnote: ^aA previous name of Yerushalayim.

Psa 76:3 There He broke the arrows of the bow, The shield and the sword and the battle-axe. Selah.

Psa 76:4 You are resplendent, More excellent than mountains of prey.
